Bylaw Revision

The bylaw revision is not intended to change the way we do things, but rather to correct the bylaws and make them match what we do. Throughout the year, through the monthly questionnaires and discussions, you have given your input on various questions. These have been incorporated into the proposed revisions.

According to the bylaws, Article XIV - Amendments:

A. The bylaws may be amended at any regularly scheduled meeting by a two-thirds vote of the active members. *(We are in the process of identifying the active members, active being by attendance or participation in guild activities.)*

B. The proposed changes shall appear in the newsletter one month prior to the scheduled voting date. *(The proposed changes are printed below and will be voted on in September. If any of the proposed changes require discussion, we will discuss them at the August meeting.)*

The two-page summary of the revisions is printed below. A complete copy of the bylaws, with the proposed revisions, is sent with the newsletter as a separate attachment.

Proposed Updates to the Bylaws August 2019

Listed below are the proposed updates to the bylaws. These suggested changes are based on the responses to the monthly questionnaires. This will be printed in the August newsletter and voted on in September (must be published 30 days prior to the vote). A 2/3 vote of the active members is required to make these changes.

GUILD OVERVIEW:

(Para 3) The Red River Quilters' Guild (RRQG) is a ~~non~~-not-for profit, non-discriminating organization. Its purpose is to preserve the heritage of quilting.

(Para 5) Our general meetings are held on the first (1st) Monday of every month at the Vernon College in Wichita Falls, located at 4105 Maplewood Ave, Wichita Falls, Texas 76308. Registration begins at ~~6:30~~ 6:00 p.m. and the meeting begins at ~~7:00~~ 6:30 p.m.

RRQG POLICIES

~~Para 2 - Delete: No children under age twelve (12) are permitted at Guild meetings. May 4, 1992. The Guild appreciates your leaving children and babies at home. (2015)~~

~~Para 4 - Delete: RRQG will have one door prize per month and it will be of approximately \$20.00 in value. (2015)~~

~~Para 5 - Add: "and is not-transferrable":~~

RRQG workshop fees are fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for members and twenty dollars (\$20.00) for non-members. Sponsored workshop fees will be adjusted as necessary. Members shall receive one free workshop with their membership to be used during the calendar year. The free workshop cannot be used for sponsored workshops and is non-transferrable. (2015)

BYLAWS

Article I – Name and Definition. Change non-profit to not-for-profit:

The Red River Quilters' Guild is a ~~non~~-not-for-Profit, non-discriminating organization as regards to race, color, creed, age, sex, or national origin for those interested in all aspects of quilting. The guild shall not be for profit, and no part of its assets shall accrue to the benefit of any individual.

Article III – Membership. Delete age 12 limit:

A. Membership shall be open to any individual ~~age 12 and over~~ who has an interest in quilts.

~~I. Guests shall be at least twelve (12) years old.~~

~~J. New members, upon joining the guild, new members, shall receive a copy of the current RRQG General Information (bylaws and policies) book, and name tag. Members shall receive a monthly guild newsletter and an annual RRQG Membership Directory. All members shall receive a RRQG General Information Book every even year. New members shall attend a minimum of six (6) guild meetings prior to voting on the election of officers.~~

~~K. Members shall receive a monthly guild newsletter and an annual RRQG Membership Directory. All members shall receive a RRQG General Information Book every even year.~~

Article VI – Fiscal: Delete Educational Funds

~~D. Educational funds:~~

~~A. Proceeds from the quilt show miniature quilt sales shall be used to subsidize educational funds. The treasurer shall keep a separate accounting of these funds.~~

~~B. Educational fund shall be used to subsidize workshops when needed and to purchase materials for the guild library. Educational funds must be spent within two (2) years after they become available. If the funds are not spent within the two (2) year period, they shall revert to the guild's general fund.~~

~~C. Funds may be used to further the preservation of the quilting art through charities and/or sponsorship as approved by the executive board.~~

~~D. A minimum of three hundred dollar (\$300) scholarship for each fall and spring semester may be presented to Midwestern State University for a student majoring in an art related field. Scholarships will be awarded in July and December.~~

G. Add: An amount of six hundred (\$600) can be used to subsidize longarm quilters who quilt large numbers of comfort quilts. This will be divided proportionately among the longarm quilters.

Article VIII – Duties of Officers

B. Vice President -- The Vice President shall:

~~4. Coordinate with MSU to invite the scholarship recipient to a guild meeting and to include the scholarship in any list of scholarships awarded.~~

D. Treasurer – The Treasurer shall: (add "or printed in the monthly newsletter".)

5. Prepare a monthly financial report to be given at the general meeting or printed in the monthly newsletter.

Article XI - Committees

1. *Quilt Show* -- The quilt show chair should be appointed 18-24 months prior to the scheduled quilt show and shall be responsible for the administration of the quilt show. (add should be appointed 18-24 months prior to the scheduled quilt show and)

Article XIII – Quilt Show

C. The quilt show chair shall:

~~3. Present a list of committees and chairs for the show to the executive board.~~

Quilting in the Falls July 2019 Newsletter Report

Show Dates: September 27-28, 2019

Countdown to Quilting in the Falls! July – August – September – It's getting close!

Quilt Entry Forms are due at the August Meeting. Your quilt doesn't need to be finished by the August meeting, but it will need to be finished before the turn-in Date of September 25. Each quilt should have its own entry form. You may write one check for multiple entries. Take a picture of your quilt or the pattern picture and attach it to the back side of each entry form, with the picture side facing out. This will greatly assist with the planning of the layout of the quilts.

Quilts need to have a label on the back with the name of the quilt, your name, and the quilt maker if not you. When you turn them in, they should be in a pillow case with your name and phone number on the outside of the pillow case. Quilts should be clean, free of pet hair, and odor free. BE sure to remove all loose threads.

At the August meeting we will give more details on where and how to turn in quilts. We will also give details of the quilt show set-up and activities during the quilt show.

The attached Rules, Categories, and Entry Form will help you with the specifics.

Volunteers: The quilt show needs helpers Thursday for set-up, Friday and Saturday at the show, and Saturday for ear-down. The Volunteers Committee will be asking members to sign up for a specific area at the July meeting. Terry Coleman, Volunteer Chair, will not be at the July meeting, and Mary McElvain will be taking names for her.

ALSO:

We have a lot of new members who are not familiar with our quilt show. Many of our previous members know all of this, but some may not. Hopefully this overview will give you more details.

We have a quilt show, *Quilting in the Falls*, every year. It is our "Show and Tell" to the public. It isn't about winning a ribbon, though that is nice and we award a lot, but about showing our craft to the community. Everyone is encouraged to enter quilts. We can't have a quilt show without quilts! With the larger room, we are advertising 200 quilts, so please, please enter at least one quilt and hopefully several. This is our fund raiser of the year that supports our guild and our charities.

Quilt Entry: The Rules, Categories, and Entry Form will give you more information.

These are attached below and also on the website. Members pay \$5 to enter their quilts, non-members pay \$25. Members are encouraged to enter several quilts as we have a larger room this year and advertised 200 quilts. Each entry should have a separate form and a picture of your quilt. The picture helps the committee with planning the layout of the quilts for display.

Boutique: The Boutique items are hand crafted items that will sell at the quilt show. It can be about anything hand-made, either sewn, crocheted, knitted, or other. Examples are pin cushions, aprons, pillow cases, pot holders, and just about anything hand made. We try not to compete with our vendors, so no embroidered towels please. Old quilt magazines are bundled in groups of 12 and sold for \$3 per bundle. Old books are sold for \$1-\$5 each. Give Boutique items to Annette Ritchie.

Mason Jar Auction: The Mason Jar Auction is similar to a brown bag auction, if you are familiar with those. Items are donated and are new or like-new non-hand made items, such as rulers, rotary cutters, jelly rolls, irons, ruler stands, etc. They do not have to be quilt related as we have non-quilters attending our show, too. One year we had a mechanic's stool, so anything new or like new. New items are put out each day. Tickets are 25 for \$5 and you put your tickets in the mason jar of the item you hope to win. At the end of the day tickets are drawn and if your ticket is drawn then you win that item. Give donated items to Sheri McGee.

Fat Quarter Baskets: Donated Fat Quarters are separated and put in baskets and are placed in the Mason Jar Auction.

Quilt Items for Sale: People often attend the quilt show hoping to purchase a quilt. Members are asked to donate miniature quilts, table runners, lap quilts, or quilts of any size. The quilts will be priced for immediate sale. Suggested items for this are baby quilts, youth-themed items, sports teams, anything someone would like to buy as a Christmas gift for a loved one. Give quilt items for sale to Barbara Wesley.

Program Ads: We give out a program at our quilt show and we ask local vendors to place an ad. Our books are regular paper folded in half, so the size is 5.5" x 8.5". We sell three sizes of ads. The goal is to sell enough ads to pay for the printing of the program (about \$900). Any ads we sell above that amount is pure profit for the guild. You can get a form and copy of last year's program from Brenda Owens.

Remember, all the forms are on the website, WichitaFallsQuiltGuild.org. You can print the Program Ads Form, Rules, Categories and Entry Form at your convenience. If you have any questions, please ask one of your board members, a quilt show committee member, or me.

Rules for Entering Quilts

September 27-28, 2019, MPEC, Wichita Falls, Texas

Please read all rules and instructions before completing the entry form.

Entry Fees. Members \$5.00, Youth \$10, Non-Members \$25, for each quilt entered in the show.

Make check(s) payable to RRQG and attach it to your entry form(s).

Categories: RRQG reserves the right to place a quilt into a category different from that indicated by the entrant if a quilt is obviously entered in a wrong category. Exact quilt measurements are *required* on the entry form for use in placement in the show layout.

Photograph: A Photograph of your quilt or quilt top *is required* with *each* entry form. The quilt needn't be finished at this point, but a photograph or drawing is essential in planning the quilt show layout. Print photo on back of entry form or staple it to the back *with the photo facing out*.

Entries shown in the **2017 and 2018** RRQG shows are not eligible for showing in 2019.

Clean and odor free. Quilts should be clean, free of pet hair, and odor free. Quilts determined to be offensive to the judge or the hanging committee may be disqualified and not hung.

Ribbons for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and Honorable Mention will be awarded in all categories unless entered for "exhibit only". Ribbons will also be awarded for "Judge's Choice", "People's Choice", "Member's Choice", "Vendor's Choice", and "Honorary Judge's Choice".

Quilt Label. A quilt label is *required* to be sewn to the lower back edge of each quilt with the entrant's name and title of entry.

Quilt Bags. All entries, including shipped entries, *must* be submitted in a cloth bag (*pillowcase*) labeled with the entrant's *name and telephone number*.

Entry form. One form must be completed for *each* quilt being entered. The due date for submitting entries is **August 5, 2019** at the **Guild meeting**. Entry forms not turned in at the meeting can be mailed, postmarked no later than Wednesday, August 7, 2019, to: Mary McElvain, 1528 Bacon Switch Rd, Iowa Park, TX 76367. **Late entries will not be accepted.** *Entries will not be accepted without your signature on the Hold Harmless Agreement on the Entry Form.* RRQG reserves the right to refuse any entry it deems inappropriate, that is incomplete, or which fails to meet entry requirements.

Local entries: Deliver entries in person on **Wednesday, September 25, 2019**, between **10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. or 4:00 pm - 7:00 pm.** *Entries will not be accepted at any other time or place.* You will receive a receipt, which *must* be presented to pick up your quilt after the show.

Deliver entries to: *Jane Benson 4631 Pendleton Dr., Wichita Falls, Texas.*

Pick up after the show: Quilts will be available for pick up after the show on **Saturday, September 28 between 5:30 and 6:00 p.m.** at the MPEC center *after all quilts have been taken down, bagged and sorted.* Please wait patiently while the takedown occurs. **For security reasons, quilts may not be taken down or removed early or by anyone not on the takedown committee.** Receipt *must* be presented to pick up your quilt.

Out of town entries: Ship the entry in a secure carton to *Jane Benson 4631 Pendleton Dr., Wichita Falls, Texas. 76310.* Be sure that a cloth bag (pillowcase) labeled with the entrant's name, address, telephone number and title of the entry is attached. If we will be shipping your entry back to you, a prepaid return label, including insurance charges, must be included. Entries must be received no later than **September 20, 2019.** No exceptions.

RRQG is not responsible for lost or delayed receipt of any entry. Mailed quilts may be picked up on Saturday, September 28 at the MPEC between 5:30 pm and 6:00 pm.

ENTRY CATEGORIES FOR 2019 QUILT SHOW

Categories are determined by the *type of quilting or patchwork* rather than size. If the number in sub-categories are large enough, entries may be further sub-divided by size or other techniques.

All entries must meet the definition of a quilt -- at least three layers of fabric held together with stitches. The middle layer may be batting or any other type of fabric.

Refer to the Quilt Show Rules for instructions and rules. Complete one Entry Form for each quilt submitted.

All entries must be capable of being hung with plastic hangers for display.

Determine which category best fits your entry. The committee reserves the right to move an entry to a different category if appropriate.

Categories will be subdivided if deemed necessary and appropriate by the committee.

Hand Quilted: (quilting is done by hand)

100 Pieced

100A Appliquéd

Machine Quilted by Home Machine or Mid-arm (Quilting done with a table-top machine)

200 Pieced (Construction is predominately pieced)

200A Paper Pieced (Construction is predominately paper pieced)

200B Appliquéd (Construction is predominately appliquéd)

200C Other (Mixed Technique, Embroidery or Whole Cloth)

Longarm Non-Custom Quilting: (Quilting is done edge-to-edge, free motion or meandering)

300 Pieced (Construction is predominately pieced)

300A Paper Pieced (Construction is predominately paper pieced)

300B Appliquéd (Construction is predominately appliquéd)

300C Other (Mixed Technique, Embroidery or Whole Cloth)

Custom Quilting: (Quilt blocks contain individual designs in each block or area of the quilt)

400 Pieced (Construction is predominately pieced)

400A Paper Pieced (Construction is predominately paper pieced)

400B Appliquéd (Construction is predominately appliquéd)

400C Other (Mixed Technique, Embroidery or Whole Cloth)

Special Categories

500 First Quilt (Can be any size or any technique)

600 Young Quilters (Any quilt made by a quilter aged 17 or under)

700 Art Quilt (An original design, a creative interpretation, something different)

700A Pictorial (Recognized scene or object and made from a pattern or published design)

800 Miniature (Not just a small quilt, but a miniature version of a larger quilt.

Not to exceed 100" outside perimeter. Blocks of a pieced miniature must not exceed 4")

900 Garment (must include a recognizable amount of patchwork, appliqué and/or quilting)

1000 Non-Judged (antique, restored treasure, or one that you would like the public to enjoy)
