### Balkan Puzzle April

Light: Cut 4 patches at 3" square

Medium: Cut 1 patch at 4-1/2" square

Dark: Cut 4 patches at 3" square

Cut 4 patches at 2-1/2" Square

Make: 4 HSQ of light/dark


Use the 3" squares to make Half Square Triangles as follows:

Using 4 light and 4 dark, make 8 HSQ in light/dark

TRIM to 2-1/2" if needed

Sew HSQ to dark square as in diagram. Make 4

Sew together as shown in diagram.

### **Upcoming Workshops** — Trudy Wallace \*\*



The workshop for April 18th is Alice Wilhoit teaching her six hour hand applique workshop. The only supplies you need to bring are two pairs of scissors, one for paper and one for fabric. Let me introduce Alice:

Most of us have had the experience of becoming "all out excited" over a new hoppy or activity only to cool once the "new" has worn off. Usually this leads to an unfinished project, or projects if the excitement was really great, being relegated to a forgotten box on some closet shelf. That was Alice's story until some 20 years ago when she took a class at local quilt shop and found herself immersed in a world of infinite possibilities with fabrics. She has never "cooled" or even looked back. In this time, Alice has produced something over 250 quilts, many of them her own design.

Many have won awards in quilt shows and festivals. Her designs and patterns are sold in quilt shops around the country. American Quilter's Society published her book, *Crazy Patchwork*, in 2009 In 1987, Alice began instructing, and soon coordinated all teaching at the leading quilt shop in her area. Now she teaches in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex. She travels to teach across the U.S., Canada and has taught on many cruises.

Although she designs both traditional pieces and appliqued quilts, her true love, other than her husband, children and grandchildren, is teaching others the art of applique, crazy patchwork and just about any kind of handwork. Through her years of experience she has developed many labor and time saving tips to aid in the preparation portion of applique. These she happily shares!!!

One of her greatest joys is seeing someone develop into a dedicated quilter regardless of the style or method chosen.

Alice is married to Bill, has six daughters, a son and seven grandchildren, five great-grandsons and two great-granddaughters. She and Bill live in McKinney, Texas along with their Scottish Terrier Mix, Lucy, who is queen of the household.

The workshop is \$15.00 for RRQG members and \$20.00 for non-members. Remember to sign up for the workshop at the next meeting, it is limited to the first 25 people.
