We have some great workshops lined up for you this year. We hope you find them interesting and will sign up for the classes!

Many thanks to Marianne Pattillo for teaching the "Shimmering Cross" in March. If you missed it, you missed a good one.

- **April 16**: Audrey Bee will teach the "Split 9-Patch." This is a versatile block that, depending on how you lay out the blocks, can give you many different patterns. You will want to make several for the different layouts. A pattern will be provided in class.
- **May 21**: Cindy Simmons will teach us the "Double Irish Chain." This is a standard, popular quilt pattern that you will enjoy. She will be teaching the Eleanor Burns version and you will need the book. If you don't have one, Cindy can order one for you.
- **June 18**: Diane Walker will be teaching a *purse*, complete with zipper and pocket. Diane says the zipper is easy and I am anxious to learn her method. Diane presented the March guild program and gave us a sample of her talents. You won't want to miss this one!

Using either your own fabric or that which is available at our guild meetings, work at your own pace, be the boss of your own efforts, and we will get it finished and donated.

Don't forget to feel free to come to the Comfort Quilts table. Melissa Taylor and friends did a very good job of matching fabrics and creating a mound of bagged fabrics matched up for quilting from our fabric storage. Feel free to stitch a quilt top and bring it for someone else to finish. Very generous stitchers are willing to quilt what you can piece. Maybe you can add binding to a quilt that just needs finishing. Batting is available from the Guild for those who are quilting Comfort Quilts.

Breakfast is set out early and left out all morning. This accommodates both the early risers and the late sleepers. Breakfast consists of make-your-own-waffles, oatmeal, sweet rolls, hard boiled eggs, etc. Lunch and Dinner are prepared by a chef and the meals are outstanding.

<u>Patio</u>


Peaceful, relaxing, has waterfall and fire pit.
